

PILOTS PILE UP 64 1-12 PTS.

DeLaSalle Breezes To 3rd Track Title

There's proof in the points and DeLaSalle High converted all doubters Wednesday.

The Pilots, who work at track to reap their rewards, turned on the power again Wednesday and swept to a third straight Catholic League title. The Pilots rolled up 64½ points to 33½ for second-place Catholic Central.

Seventeen other squads split up the remaining 98 points.

LaSALLE had both individual brilliance and squad balance. The East Siders won seven firsts and placed in 11 of the 13 events, falling only in the half-mile and mile relay.

In the two-day meet at U-D Stadium LaSalle set one record and tied another. Nick Frontczak tossed the shot a record 51 feet 5 inches and sprinter Larry Cichocki equalled the 220-yard record of :22.4.

Cichocki might have had a record, too, in the century had he attended strictly to business. Some 30 yards from the wire he knew he was ahead but appeared unduly concerned over teammate Frank Schoebel's progress in an adjoining lane.

Two or three times he turned his head to look for Schoebel, who did finish second, and the slight twist of his shoulders

probably cost him a fraction of a second or so.

As things turned out Cichocki was clocked in :10.3, one-tenth of a second off the league mark.

CARL WIATR of St. Joseph and Paul Sullivan of Catholic Central accounted for the other

two records over a dusty but speedy track.

Wiatr lowered the league's half-mile mark to 2:03.7 while Sullivan clipped a full second off the mile mark when he came charging home in 4:38.9.

In addition to Cichocki, Jerome Deska was the meet's only other double winner.

Deska won both hurdles, tied for second in the high jump and ran a leg on the winning sprint relay team for a personal contribution of 14½ points, the best individual output of any of the 200 athletes entered.
