MOUNT PLEASANT—(AP)—Four unearned runs in one inning gave Central Michigan a 4-3 victory over league-leading Southern Illinois Friday in an Interstate Conference baseball game.

CMU piled up all its runs in the seventh on a single by Sam Licavoli, two walks, a wild pitch and two infield errors.

Pitcher Garry Gurley of Southern Illinois took his first loss of the season after eight victories. CMU pitcher Jim Boron boosted his won-lost record to 4-3.

The defeat cut Southern Illinois' league lead to 1½ games. CMU moved into a tie for fourth in the seven-team conference.

The Crusaders won the distance medley (440-880-¾-mile and mile) with a new record of 11:05.9. The old mark was 11:15.4. Running the event were: Bob Vivian, Ed Moseley, Wally Herrala and Joe Cote. Cote's anchor mile was timed unofficially at 4:38.9.

Catholic's sprint medley team of Jerry Winston, Bill Wolski, George Dorato and Joe Kowalski ran the 440-220-220-440 in 2:32.8 to break the old mark of 2:33.1.

The two-mile relay team of Steve Kelley, Dave Connell, Bernie Jay and Tom Lipps finished second in its event in 8:50. The winning time was 8:38.

In the shot put relay, Catholic finished third with 131 feet, 7 inches. Niles won with 137-5 and Holland 136-4. Daryl Rich, Jim Mason and Wolski competed for the Crusaders.

Bobby Johnson, Winston and Kowalski finished fourth in the broad jump relay behind Kalamazoo Central, Niles and Portage.

Johnson, Winston and Vivian took fifth for Catholic in the high jump relay behind Holland, Kalamazoo Central, Kalamazoo Loy Norrix and Portage.

The Crusader 440-yard relay team was fifth with Dave Lasser, Bill Grabinski, Bobby Johnson and Jim Mason.

Catholic's 880-yard relay team was leading when Wolski and Kowalski dropped the baton on the first exchange. The team managed to finish third but was disqualified because the baton was out of the lane.

Niles compiled 78 points, Kalamazoo Central 76, Holland 52 and Catholic 42 in the team scores:
