## Second Place By Thinclads Turns Trick

Win Three Events  
In Six-A Program

Ann Arbor High had the cherished Six-A League All-Sports Trophy in its showcase again today and the Pioneers were offering thanks to their track competitors for making it possible.

The thinclads, coached by Tim Ryan and Don McEwen, finished second to powerful Lansing Sexton in Saturday's Six-A League Championships at Lansing, thereby picking up five trophy points to break a 34-all deadlock with Jackson High.

Ann Arbor High and Jackson each had 34 points going into the track finale but the Vikings slumped to sixth on the cinders and thus finished second in the trophy race with 35 points. Trailing were Sexton, 31; Battle Creek, 30 1/2; Lansing Eastern, 28; and Kalamazoo, 25 1/2. Ann Arbor teams won the cross-country title, shared championships in football, golf, and tennis, placed second in swimming and track, were third in wrestling, shared fifth place in baseball, and finished sixth in basketball to regain the trophy which was held by Sexton last year.

Pioneer thinclads kept up with Sexton in the matter of individual titles, each school

Other individual winners from Ann Arbor were Brian Westfield, who had little trouble in the low hurdles, winning in 19.9 seconds, and Dennis Johnson, who took the 880 in 2:03 despite a leg injury.

Bob Spaly was second in the high hurdles behind Sexton's Mike Rainge and Jim Stenzel was fifth in the 440.
