

Carr 'Idles' To 9.8; NW Takes Lead

Henry Carr got a sizable portion of his week's track work done Thursday before that storm turned Mackenzie's track into an inland lake.

Carr, the quick senior from Northwestern High who some day may be recognized as the greatest schoolboy trackmen ever to come out of Michigan, stepped down the soft Mackenzie straightaway to win the 100-yard dash in .09.8 seconds.

With the track too slow for a record attempt, Carr ran with his sweatshirt on and a towel around his neck.

Carr isn't serious about his broadjumping. Coach Tom Hendricks lets him enter the event only because he's an almost certain winner. He rarely practices.

Thursday Carr won the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet 9½ inches. There are those who say Carr could jump 25 feet if he put his mind to it.

WITH ONLY six events completed, Northwestern built up a huge early lead, compiling 61½ points to 38 for second-place Southwestern.

The final seven events of this West Side championship will be concluded Friday on the same track, starting at 3:30 p.m.
