



A good crowd was out for Northwestern's dual track meet with Cody on the Mackenzie track

Thursday, interest in seeing Henry Carr run the 100 and 220-yard dashes.

The wind gauge showed there was practically no breeze blowing when the 100 was held, and Carr breezed to a :09.5 clocking, a tenth faster than the Public School record he set in last year's championships. Carr had done :09.4 and :20 with an assisting wind last week.

It was raining when the 220 began and Carr loped all the way, finishing second to teammates Charles Shelton. "Coach (Tom Hendricks) told us not to run too hard in the rain because we might injure ourselves," Carr explained. "All he wanted us to do was win."

Henry anchored the Northwestern half-mile relay and finished first by almost 50 yards. Northwestern slammed the 100, 200, 220, 440 and high jump while beating Cody, 73½ to 35½. Carr will have another chance at PSL records in the West Side meet at Mackenzie next Thursday.
