Carr Misses World Record by :00.1

Henry Carr will draw his final and greatest audience as a schoolboy sprinter Thursday to Pershing High School when the City League track and field championships are staged starting at 2 p.m.

If there's a spoil-sport in the crowd it will be the weatherman. Carr demonstrated Tuesday that he'll be ready for his greatest day.

Carr zoomed down the straightaway to be caught by three watches in :20.1 in his 220-yard qualifying heat. It was quite a performance, just one-tenth of a second off the world record of 20 seconds flat.

UNFORTUNATELY Carr had been aided by an eight-mile-an-hour tailwind. That is better than three miles over the allotted velocity of 4.453 mph permitted in record performances.

Wind or no wind, that's moving! No other schoolboy in the United States has ever matched this performance.

mark of :20 flat. Carr may not be that fast Thursday but he'll be only a step or two behind.

Earlier Carr had run a :09.6 100-yard dash without any wind assistance. That ties his league record set

last spring and equalled this year.

NORTHWESTERN, of course, with Carr trying for a triple (100, 220 and broad

jump) will be favored to retain its team title. Mumford, Redford and Eastern will fight it out for second place.

Secondary feature to Carr will be the 880-yard run battle between George Harris, of Eastern, and Terry Moore, of Redford. Both seniors are capable of breaking 1:56.
