

# Carr Runs :20.1, but Wind Spoils Record 2nd Time

Henry Carr needs a little cooperation if he is to have a new time written into the Public School League record books tomorrow.

The Northwestern ran 220 yards in 20.1 seconds in the Public School League track semifinals yesterday at Pershing but the perverse breeze saw to it that his mark was not accepted.

Five races were held before the 220 and there was practically no breeze on the wind gauge held by Don Bowden. Then the needle suddenly swayed toward the eight-mile mark, passing it as Carr neared the midway point. Track regulations rule out times made with the wind blowing at more than 4.47 miles an hour.

## 2ND WIND PROBLEM

This was the second time the wind erased times made by Carr. On May 18 he sprinted the 220 in 20 seconds flat, which would have tied the world record set in 1956 by Dave Sime, of Duke University. The same day he ran sprinted the 100 in :09.4, which would have tied the national scholastic record held by Jesse Owens and Jim Jackson. The wind was too strong for either to be recognized.

"I hope Henry gets a break tomorrow," declared Northwestern Coach Tom Hendricks. "He would have broken 20 seconds but slowed up to avoid crashing into the fence."

Earlier yesterday Carr was timed in 9.6 seconds in the 100, tying the PSL record he made last year. This mark will be accepted.

Carr took part in three events, qualifying second only in one, the broad jump. Redford's Dennis Holland outleaped him, 22 feet 1/2 inch to 21-9 1/2.

## 2 LEAD QUALIFIERS

Northwestern's defending champions qualified 10 individuals and a mile relay while Mumford had nine individuals

and teams in the half and mile relays. Redford has six and two relays, Eastern six and one relay, Southwestern seven and one relay.

No trials were held in the pole vault or high jump.

Coach Bruce Waha, of Redford, favors Northwestern "because of its power in the sprints."

Northwestern qualified three in both the 100 and 220 and may score more than 40 points in the two. Points are counted on the basis of 10-8-6-4-2-1.

## 82 POINTS EYED

"The team which scores 82 points will win," Hendricks predicted.

Field events will begin at 2 p.m. tomorrow, the runs at 3:30
