Injury, Loss Mar Carr's Last Meet

Henry Carr closed his phenomenal high school career with an injury and a defeat yesterday.

He will not go to an invi-

tational meet in Los Angeles next week, and his entry in the National AAU in New York a week later depends on how quickly the

pulled hamstring muscle heals.

Carr's left leg was taped heavily as he won the broad jump and 100-yard dash in the Public School League track championship on the Pershing track.

After an hour's rest he started in the 220 and ran in fifth place until the last 50 yards, when he spurred to tie Charles Shelton, of Northwestern, for second place. Bob Harris, another Northwestern sprinter, was first.

"I don't care if my teammates beat me, but I couldn't stand to see a boy from another school finishing in front," Carr said while Coaches Tom Hendricks and Walter Owens worked on the injury.

Carr limped slightly after Tuesday's semifinals, in which he pulled up lame in the 220, which he ran in 20.1 seconds.

"I slowed down to avoid hitting the fence and that caused the pulled muscle," he explained.

Carr, Bob Harris and Shelton finished 1-2-3 in the 100, and the 48 points in the two sprints enabled Northwestern to win the PSL team title for the second consecutive year.

The 1960 champions scored 84 1-5 points to 57 for runner-up Redford.

2 RECORDS SET

Two records were broken Eastern's mile relay, composed of George Harris, Roy Morman, Tilmon Blair and Clanta Watson, won the race in 3:24, against the record of 3:25.5 set by Eastern in last week's East Side meet.

The most exciting race, however, was the half-mile in which Terry Moore, of Redford, edged George Harris in a record 1:55. The Eastern runner established the mark of 1:56.2 last week.

Harris then moved into the lead on the second lap and Moore challenged with 220 yards to go. The Eastern half-miler stayed in front and seemed assured of victory. Moore refused to concede, however, and pulled ahead at the finish.

COACH CALLS IT TIE

Eastern Coach Lorenzo Wright insisted it was a dead heat.

"I want to see the movies before I'm satisfied," he declared.

The officials, though, gave it to Moore by a whisker.
