Entries for the fifth annual Flint Olympian Games July 31-Aug. 5 are more than one-third of the way toward the goal of 4,200 participants, General Chairman Bruce Jacobs announced Tuesday.

Headed by a whopping 857 basketball entries, the entry total is 1,410. Basketball accounts for more than twice as many as the next largest sport. Track is second with 307 with wrestling third at 157 and swimming fourth at 112.

The 1,410 figure actually represents considerably more participation because some entries are for more than one event. The top four categories alone account for 1,433 separate events. The total of events entered is 1,756.

Jacobs' latest comparison report indicates steady progress toward the 4,200 goal. The only sports among 27 Olympian Games events which are behind last year's pace are badminton, bicycle racing, gymnastics and trap and skeet.

Because of the large interest in basketball, Chairman Don Butcher reminds teams that Friday at 5 p.m. is the entry deadline. Entries must be submitted either to Butcher at Bryant Junior High or to the Olympian Games office at Ballenger Field House.

Butcher explained that the earlier deadline was made to permit the elimination tournaments to begin next Wednesday.

Pre-Olympian bicycle racing scheduled for Saturday at Forest Park has been postponed until next Tuesday at 1:30 p.m., Chairman Al Koth announced.

Olympian girls' track meet showed a considerable drop over last week's 46 participants, the girls gave quality performances Wednesday at Southwestern High.

DeLaine Brandon in the Junior division and Eva Lou Voller in the Senior division led a record assault which produced four new marks and equaled another. Two other records were established in events contested for the first time.

Miss Brandon broke her 75-yard dash record with an 8.9 seconds time and equaled her 100-yard dash record in 12.1. Miss Voller's 12 seconds for the 100 and 10.4 for the 70-yard low hurdles broke her own marks. Sue Fowler smashed the Junior low hurdles record with a time of 12.1 seconds.

Jane Farrow's 88-7 effort in the javelin and Miss Voller's 39.3 for the 300-yard dash were records for new events.

Mike cleared 12-6 in the Senior division and Dave cleared 10-6 in the Intermediate division. Mike was the only entry in his division while Ken Robinson and Jerry Lakes trailed Dave.

William Blair cleared seven feet to win the Junior division with Rick Meyer second and Fred Nettell third. George Sargent and William Lee cleared 10-6 in the Senior division with Sargent declared the winner on the basis of fewer misses.
