Eastern Is Sixth

Flint Northern Wins Track Invitational

MT. PLEASANT, April 7 (AP)—Flint Northern, led by Delton Kimble, swept to victory Friday night in the Central Michigan invitational track meet.

Kimble won the 60-yard dash in record time of 6.2 seconds, breaking the old record of 6.3. He also won the 65-yard low hurdles and ran on a four-lap relay team which won its event.

Flint Northern rolled up 41 points, Flint Central 29, Pontiac 27½, Muskegon 25, Saginaw Arthur Hill 16, Lansing Eastern 12½, Mt. Pleasant 8½, Saginaw 7½, Bay City Central 6, Bay City Handy 6, Midland 1, Traverse City 0.

Charles Gray of Pontiac Central won the broad jump with a leap of 21 feet, 2½ inches. Ernest Long of Flint Central took the 65-yard high hurdles in 8.4 seconds.

Tom Jacob of Saginaw Arthur Hill won the 440-yard dash with a time of 55.2.

A Flint Central team of Bosie Mathis, Bob Barnett, Connie Conners and Pete Sinclair won the medley relay.

Al Washington of Flint Northern captured the high jump with a leap of 6 feet, one inch.

Vaughn Goodenow of Saginaw Arthur Hill ran the mile in 4:49.3 for first place. Alex Shorter of Pontiac Central put the shot 51 feet, 8 inches for victory.

Bill Clark of Mt. Pleasant and John Stewart of Pontiac Central tied in the pole vault at 12 feet.

Lansing Eastern's best individual showing came from Earl Hall, who won his heat of the 440, finishing second when heat times were compared. The sprint medley relay team was second and the distance medley team fourth.

Other points for Eastern came from fifth places by Bob Stanek in the high hurdles, Jim Croley in the mile, and a tie for fifth by Denny Hill in the half-mile.
