The first Detroit News listings of top performances to appear this season indicate tough competition in every event and the strong possibility of some new, records.

Only two Michigan high school boys ever have jumped 6-6 before. Willis Ward made it in 1931 as a student at Detroit's Northwestern High and Iowa football end Felton Rogers did it in 1959 at Eastern.

Washington, however, has to share the spotlight with some other outstanding individuals. Ferndale sprinter Dorie Reid, the defending Class A champion, has twice been clocked in 9.7 seconds for the 100 and has a real rival in Muskegon Heights' Joe Parham, who has a wind-assisted :09.6.


