# Allegan in Track Win Over U-High

## Luttrell Breaks Broad Jump Record

ALLEGAN — Walter (Buzz) Luttrell broke a 29-year-old broad jump record here Monday afternoon as Allegan handed Wolverine Conference rival Kalamazoo University High a 62 1/2-46 3/4 track and field setback.

Luttrell leaped 21 feet, 9 3/4 inches to eclipse the Allegan record of 21-4 set back in 1933 by George Humm in the outstanding individual achievement of the day.

BUT THE all-round star had plenty of help as Allegan kept its conference title hopes alive. Jack Little won the high jump and shared first in the pole vault for coach Roy Borning's Tigers, Dave Thompson put the shot 47-11 and Bob Thomson ripped off a 2.04.8 half-mile and ran a leg in the mile relay for other outstanding Allegan efforts.

Ken Calhoun and Jim Hinz provided all five U-High firsts. Calhoun won the 100 and 220-yard dashes and shared first with Little in the pole vault. Hinz, running into a stiff wind, won the high hurdles in :16.4 and the lows in :21.8.

U-HIGH had expected to win both relays and could have won the meet by doing so. But the Cubs were disqualified in the 880 for passing the baton outside the exchange zone and were surprised in the mile when Allegan turned in a 3:41.5 time, chiefly on a brilliant quarter leg by Thomson.
