Maroons Win 11 Events in Night Meet

Len Turner Cops Hurdle Victories

A beautiful, warm night provided the proper setting for some of the finest track marks of the Greater-Kalamazoo season as balanced Central handed Loy Norrix a 71-38 defeat at the Knight Stadium Monday

Taking 11 first places, including both relay events, coach Elf Pedler's hard-kicking Maroons never let the makings of a Norrix upset develop

LEN TURNER was the meet's only double-winner, copping both hurdle events as the Maroons swept the 180-yard low sticks with McArthur Jones and Don Thompson following Turner, who turned in the best G-K time of the season, a :21.2 He won the lows with a 16.6 time with teammate Jim Towne second

Dash star Norm Gottlieb put Central on the G-K honor board again in the 220-yard, edging Wes Carpenter of Norrix, with a fine :23.0 performance.

Carpenter, who won the high jump with a leap of five feet, nine inches, also finished second in the 100-yard, behind Central's Gus Johnson and his :10.6.

Norrix coach Art Jevert and the Knight fans had plenty more to cheer about in the mile run, when both Dan Fanselow and Carl Miller streaked in under the previous G-K seasonal mark of 4:43.1 Fanselow broke his own mark with a 4:40.0 and Miller had 4:41.0

Nearly all the estimated 200 fans were on their feet for the finish of the half mile which saw Central's John Thurston barely nip Mike Long of Norrix. Long had caught and passed the Central flash on the last turn before Thurston's burst at the tape brought victory and a 2:07.8 time

Mike Thompson wasn't pushed quite as much in the quarter, winning with a :52.7, but the Knights' Walt Hamacher ran a :54.0, the best ever recorded by a Norrix sprinter.

Central's Walt Worthy, who won the broad jump with a leap of 20 feet, five inches, ran a .22.8 leg in the Maroon's 880 relay victory, but didn't compete in the century or 220 because of a recent tooth extraction
