RAMS PREVAIL, 80-29

South Haven Smashes Paw Paw's Win Streak

SOUTH HAVEN — Paw Paw's 66-meet track and field win streak came to a smashing end here Monday night when South Haven rolled to a lopsided 80-29 Wolverine Conference triumph.

Coach Ron DenUyl's host Rams won all but two of the 13 events and completely dominated the activity.

Dick Gaston, the 440 star, tried the sprints for South Haven and won the 100 and 220 yard dashes and ran anchor on the winning Ram 880-yard relay team

Coach Wayne Falan's Paw Paw team's only firsts were provided by Jack Klimach in the low hurdles and Bud McCarty in the 440-yard dash.

Both squads will compete in Wednesday's Portage Optimist Relays.
