

FERNDALE'S REID HOT Prep Wins 3 Events And Leg of Relay

Fast-footed Doris Reid ascended the climb of Redford High Saturday as he gained the State Class A track finals in three events and led his Ferndale teammates to a surprise victory in the 880-yard relay against Detroit's best.

The 200-pound, 130-pound sprinter won the 100-yard and 200-yard dashes, led the qualifiers in the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet 2 1/2 inches and passed the Northwestern and Mumfords anchor men in the final spurt of the 880-yarder.

BUT REID'S amazing afternoon came to a painful end when he pulled up lame after winning the 200-yard dash, his final event of the day.

Reid pulled a muscle in the back of his right leg in the 100-yard dash and managed it and walked it to keep it loose.

Reid was visibly in pain as he fought off the challenges of Matt Jackson of Chapeau and Jim Beach of Northwestern in the 200.

His time in the final was timed in 21.4 seconds.

University of Michigan-bound Reid broke the own state record for the 100-yard dash as he beat down the track in .09.6 to better the old mark of 1:0.8 Bill Bennett of I-D High was a distant second with 1:0.1.

WHILE THE state athletic association doesn't recognize records set in the regionals, three other state marks were bettered—Redford's Dinesh Dick Sharkey, the state cross-country champion, won the mile in 4:29.8, well under the record of 4:31.8.

Theresa McBurrows of Mumfords led the 880-yard run qualifiers with a time of 1:55.7, well under the state's 1:57.7 mark, and ran a leg on Mumfords' winning mile relay team.

The time of 3:54.8 was nearly a second and a half under the present mark of 4:28.1.

Mumfords won the team trophy for the Redford regional with 38 points. Northwestern was second and Ferndale third.

The qualifiers will compete in the Class A championships next Saturday at the University of Michigan.

Get the Points?
Powerful Grosse Pointe High won nine of the 11 events held Saturday in the state Class A regional at the University of Detroit and placed men in the remaining four contests.

Grosse Pointe easily outdistanced Kalamazoo for team honors with 60 points in the Indians' 40. Class Tech led the struggle with 18 points.

The Class C meet was the reverse with Goodrich edging St. Charles, 20-10, for team honors.

HP, Service Win
Hazel Park and Service race off with regional championships at Warren-Ferguson.

Hazel Park, claiming its second straight regional crown, won five individual events and both relays in rolling up 47 1/2

points to 32 for second-place Mt. Clemens.

The Campbell was the Meigs for Hazel Park winning the 100, 200, placing third in the broad jump and anchoring the winning 880-yard relay team.

Service edged Lake Orion and Marysville in Class B for its fourth regional crown in 10 years.

Service rolled up 8 1/2 to Lake Orion's 3 1/2 and Lapeerville's 2 1/2. Bob Gutermeister, one of two seniors on the Service squad, won both the high jump and broad jump.

Crabbrook Surprises
Defending champion Lutheran West trailed Crabbrook Saturday in the Class B regional track meet at Thurston High.

Crabbrook led the B field with 48 1/2 points to Lutheran West's 40 1/2. Billy Rosenbauer was a distant third with 24 1/2.

Thurston captured the Class A honors by edging Bloomfield Hills, 45-40. Birmingham School was third with 32 points, followed by Kimball with 20 1/2.

Inlater Gets? '4
YPSILANTI—Inlater High

escaped a jam for Chase A honors here Saturday in the state Class A regional track meet at Eastern Michigan University.

Inlater team honors with 33 1/2 points.

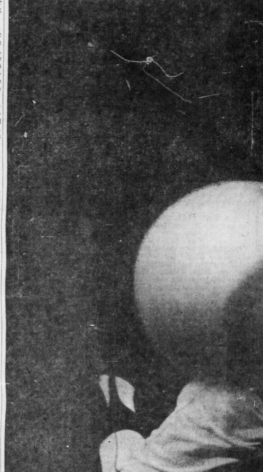
Wyandotte Romanus Wayne and Ypsilanti finished within five points of each other for the next four places.

The Class C qualifying round was dominated by Jackson St. Mary, which scored 33 1/2 points. East Jackson, Vailwood Lake, Ann Arbor and St. Thomas and University High trailed in that order.

Bill McDonald swept the hurdle events Saturday as he led Pontiac Central in the top qualifying spot in the state Class A regional track meet at Livonia Bentley.

The Chase amassed 73 points to their nearest competitor, Plymouth's 37.

Scores, runner-up in Class B last year, made a rout of its qualifying meet by beating neighbor River Rouge, 60 1/2-32 1/4. Grosse Ile and Airport were a distant third with 19 points each.
