

Clio (Class B), MSD (Class D) Win Track Titles

Bendle's Robb, Yoder Star In Regional

Powerful Clio High won the team title easily as expected, but a pair of Bendle High athletes stole the show Saturday in the Class B regional track meet at Dort Field.

Bendle's Tom Yoder set Saturday's only Class B record with the fastest 880-yard run of his life — a 2:01.0 effort. Teammate Dwight Robb won the broad jump, 100 and 220 to become the only Class B athlete to win three events.

Clio, picking up its usual 18 points with Bill Cook and Dean Bloss finishing 1-2 in both hurdles events, won its first Class B regional in history with ease.

Coach Forddy Kennedy's Mustangs rolled up 47 points to 30 for second place Kearsley, twice defending champion. Bendle had 29 on five first places and a second. No other team got more than three firsts.

The victory was Clio's fourth straight big title on successive weekends after years of track obscurity. The Mustangs won trophies at the Cass City Relays, Albion Track Carnival and the Big Eight Meet at Owosso the last three weeks. Clio's last regional victory was in Class C in 1953.

The first three finishers in each event qualify for the state Class B meet at Michigan State University in East Lansing next Saturday. Six high jumpers qualified because of a five-way tie for second.

With so many talented milers in Flint area Class B schools, and because of last week's disqualification of Kearsley's Ed Cummings

in the Big Eight meet last week, the mile run was a feature event. Cummings, who had shrugged off his disqualification with a comment, "there's always the regional," proved he was the area's best Class B miler.

Grand Blanc freshman Bill Goodyear led through the first half, then Cummings moved out. Clio's Ken Shumate, declared last week's Big Eight winner after

finishing second to Cummings, moved into second. Shumate's final spurt wasn't quite enough and his head was nearly on Cummings' shoulder at the finish.

Cummings won in 4:41 and Shumate was timed in 4:41.1. In the Big Eight meet Cummings was timed in 4:38.3 and Shumate's winning time was 4:35.6.

Another big race was the 440, and Grand Blanc's Tom Jewett beat teammate Glenn Duddle, winner of a heat in last year's state meet. Duddle passed up the conference meet last week because of a pulled leg muscle. He qualified for the state meet with his second place.

Yoder, his fine 880 reputation clouded a few weeks ago when Ainsworth's Steve Gosnell beat him in 2:01.7 in a dual meet, wasn't pressed in his record run. His 2.01 beat the regional record

of 2:02.3 by Bill Baldwin in 1959.

Robb broad jumped 21-2½, copped the 100 in 10:45 (five-tenths of a second off the record) and the 220 in 23.6.

"Now I know why the sprint records aren't lower here," said Robb. "I've run 1,000 yards today in preliminaries and finals at full speed."
