Ann Arbor High's trackmen have proved to Coach Tim Ryan that they're pretty good mudders, too.

During the indoor season, the Pioneers roared to four straight dual-meet victories and they opened the outdoor campaign in good weather with a decisive triumph over Kalamazoo Central.

Yesterday, a driving rain-storm soaked the track, the athletes and the officials but the Pioneers frolicked to a 74 1/2-33 1/2 victory over Battle Creek in a match which was supposed to be close.

Again it was a well-balanced team effort which resulted in victory for the local unit. Six athletes won as many events.

Bill Johnston, turning on the steam with three-quarters of a lap to go, won the 880 in a breeze. A tiring Mike Lillie fought off a spectacular stretch rush by Jessie Flemming in the 440. Kelly Rea led the Pioneer sweep in the low hurdles by a comfortable margin. And Tom King also was at the head of the pack in the 220 sweep. Larry Burner needed only a leap of 10 feet 6 inches to win the pole vault.

The high jump was held indoors and it was in that event that the Pioneers got their most spectacular performance. Without a miss, Ken Dyer moved to the top of the list and stopped at 6-1 after the field had been eliminated at 5-10.

A sore knee and two kicked-over low hurdles helped turn the meet into a rout for Ann Arbor. Jim Burise, Six-A League sprint champ, pulled up limping after the 100-yard dash and was advised by Coach Jack Finn not to run in the 220. Dave Thatch, the Bearcats' outstanding hurdler, knocked over the first two hurdles and barely saved himself from falling headlong into the mud.

The Pioneers won't be around for a home match again until a week from tomorrow. On that date, they'll engage Lansing Sexton, defending Six-A titlist, after participating in the Albion Invitational this weekend and visiting Lansing Eastern on Tuesday.

Prep Schedules Disrupted But Can Be Reshaped

The weatherman smiled on local and area prep athletes today indicating a big day of baseball and track activity would go on as scheduled.

But yesterday's rain caused the postponement of five baseball games, four track meets, two tennis meets, and a golf match.
