

U-D Gets Fast Lead

University of Detroit High, favored to unseat DeLaSalle as Catholic League First Division track king, jumped to a quick lead Tuesday as field event finals and track event qualifying was staged over the U-D oval.

With Keith Bradley setting a high-jump record of six-feet-two, the Cubs rolled up 13 points in three events. Servite was second with 10½ points, followed by DeLaSalle six and Benedictine five.

Joe Pavelich of Benedictine accounted for the days' other record when he heaved the shot 51 feet, 11½ inches.
