Triple Winner Still on a Loser

Roger Qualman, a senior from Troy High School, was a triple winner Tuesday night in the Oakland A Conference track and field championships at Warren-Fitzgerald High.

Yet his individual heroics weren't enough to bring the Colts more than a third-place finish before 500 spectators. Qualman won both hurdle events and broad jumped 20 feet two inches for his third gold medal.

Lake Orion, scoring heavily in the dashes, carried home its second straight championship trophy. Coach Charlie Bainton's squad won four firsts outright and tied for a fifth.

The Dragons set a league record of 1:36.2 in winning the sprint relay.
