State Prep Records Could Fall Tomorrow

Statisticians, prepare your erasers. At least five state records appear to be in jeopardy for tomorrow's Michigan high school track and field competition.

If this year's crop runs true to season-long form, some of the state's revered marks, including one shared by Olympian Hayes Jones, could fall.

Cinderman will toe the starting blocks at four different sites Saturday: Class A, Ann Arbor; Class B, East Lansing; Classes C-D, Mount Pleasant; and all four classes in Marquette (Upper Peninsula finals).

Wyandotte's Jerry Cerulla, who couldn't make class A finals last year, leads the pack of potential record-setters. Jerry has been beaming in on both the 120-yard high hurdle and 180-yard low hurdle records all season, the former held jointly by Jones and Farmington's Warren Cawley.

Cerulla, in non state competition already has matched their co-record of 14.4 seconds for the 180 lows. His best time this season in the latter event was :19.5.

Ferndale's Dorie Reid, who was an All-State football halfback last fall, is a threat to the oldest mark of all—the 21.7 clocking in 1925 by Detroit Northern's George Hester in the 220 yard dash, equalled by Pontiac's Alonzo Harris in 1953.

Reid, who raced for three fists last week in the regional Class A finals at Redford, has as his best time this season a 21.7 for the event.

At least two other marks seem endangered in the 880 yard relay and high jump.

Muskegon Heights' 880 quartet posted a 1:29.8 time, which is two-tenths of a second under the existing mark of 1:30.0 posted by Detroit Northwestern way back in 1927.

In the high jump, Flint Northern's Al Washington leaped 6-6 this year to exceed the accepted state mark of 6-4 9/16 set by Dearborn's Allen Ammerman in 1960.

Performances are accepted as state records only when they are set during the state meet.

Joe Parham of Muskegon Height also ranks as a threat to the 100 yard dash mark of :09.8, shared by four. His top time this season was :09.6 but he was aided by a strong wind.
