# Pointe, Heights Share Class A Track Title

ANN ARBOR—Grosse Pointe and Muskegon Heights, two schools never before admitted to the throne room, tied for the State Class A track and field title Saturday on rain-swept Ferry Field.

The new co-champions both came from behind in the mile relay, final event of the day, to catch and dethrone Flint Northern, the defending champion.

Grosse Pointe, whose best previous team finish was sixth four years ago, and Muskegon Heights, from the other end of the state, both wound up with 30 points.

Flint Northern was next with 27.

NORTHERN went into the mile relay tied with Grosse

Pointe at 26 points and one point ahead of Muskegon Heights.

The Heights came out the best in the event finishing third with Grosse Pointe fourth and Northern seventh.

Grosse Pointe got its only first-place finish from George Thomas in the 880. Thomas finished in a tie with Mumford's Theo McBurrous in 1:57.9.

Eastern High, of Detroit, placed fifth with 20 points and produced the day's most sensational winner in junior Lou Scott.

A 5-6 miler, Scott turned in a record effort of 4:17.4 in the mile, upsetting favored Dick Sharkey of Redford.

SCOTT SLICED four and four-tenths seconds off the

former mile record of 4:21.8 set by Grosse Pointe's Rem Purdy on the same track four years ago.

Scott made a surprising move on the third lap and got away with it.

Content to let Sharkey and others set the early pace, he sprinted to the top on the back straightaway and beat Sharkey at the wire by 15 feet.

Bill Yearby, who has already accepted a University of Michigan tender, gave Eastern another first.

Yearby tossed the shot 54 feet 9½ inches.
