

### Lancers Take Third Place In Class B

#### Huber 2nd In Class D Mile

Dowagiac took top honors in Class B and a pair of the area's top sprinters proved they were the best in the state to challenge southeastern Michigan entries in Saturday's state track meet.

The Chicks rolled up 38 4-8 points to capture their first team crown since 1956 with Lakeland taking 21 5-8 points to finish fourth in the State Lancing meet.

Duchess Mine Rader of Dowagiac and Lakeland's Tom Ford secured all other competition as they waged a rugged battle for first place medals.

Ford sped to victory in the 100 in 11.1 seconds with Rader winning the 200 in 22.4. The two exchanged second place positions in the events.

The Dowagiac cause was bolstered by Jerry Lindenberg who finished second in the half-mile run and Rocky Gussner's third place finish in the shot put.

Other Dowagiac point winners were Walt Ward, fourth place in the high jump, Willie Wheeler, second place in the pole vault, and the 800 yard relay team which placed first.

Tom Zupple of Lakeland paced the 400-meter dash to a first place tie with Al Poirais of Airport in the half mile.

Steve Coleman of the Lancers won the 1100-yard race to open a share of second place in the pole vault.

South Haven's Jack Gowan anchored the field in winning the Class B quarter-mile dash in the time of 55.7.

The Green Bulldogs finished second behind Michigan School For The Deaf for the second year in a row in Class D section.

#### NO FIRST PLACES

The Bulldogs scored 21 points without the benefit of a first place finisher in falling just five points short of the winner.

Spencer Roosevelt Davis matched a second in the 200 and third in the 400 with David Aldridge, Jim Woods and Larry Abrams topping two places apiece.

Albama and Aldridge were involved in a three-way tie for second in the pole vault.

The St. Joe Trojans scored 13 points to end up in a tie for fourth place with Saginaw State.

#### MARY

Ann sister Phil Huber was the outstanding performer for the St. Pauline with a second place finish.

Dan Wroblewski sprinted to fifth place in the 100 yard dash with the mile relay team gathering points on the base of a fifth place showing.

A pair of Lawrence eldermen who fired well amid the stiff competition.

Bob Vidler finished fourth in the shot put for the Tigers with Red Campbell being the only second in the 440.

Other area 177 athletes placing at Mount Pleasant were Tom Rader of Paul Chase with a sixth in the 400 and a seventh in the 800, Jerry New York of Davette finished with a fifth place in the pole vault, and Tom Knight of Okemos finished in the shot put.

Stanton Hatcher athletes, Alvin McNair and Carl Mitchell were the only area freshmen to place in Class A action at Ann Arbor.

Mitchell finished sixth in the three mile run and Carl Mitchell was part of a six-way tie for fifth in the half mile as the Tigers tallied 27 1/2 points on the two-day track meet.
