# Local Trackmen Win 2 'C' Crowns

MOUNT PLEASANT — Battle Creek's two top entries—Springfield and St. Philip—made strong showings in the State Class C track championships here yesterday, but two Lansing schools finished 12 in the meet.

Lansing St. Mary won the championship with 40½ points while Boys Training School finished with 37.

Springfield 4th

Springfield finished fourth, just two points behind East Jackson which had 23. St. Philip tied for eighth place with Hart on 10 points.

But the two Battle Creek schools produced individual champions. Springfield's Mike Rocca won the shot put with a heave of 47 feet, 11 inches. In addition, Jerry McQuern took a second in the low barriers and a fourth in the high barriers. The 880-yard relay team of Jim Slaughter, Rocca, McQuern and Bill Cole placed second.

St. Philip also produced a state champion when its mile relay team of Dan Kajietinski, Herb Harmon, Dennis Cripps and Jim Bauman was timed in 3:34.3. The Tigers' 880 relay team took a fifth. St. Philip was defending state mile relay champion.

East Jackson's Dave Loomis was a double winner in the dashes by taking the century in 10.15 seconds and the 220 in 22.3 seconds.

Centreville's Charles Washington, who set the Class D record last year in the high jump when his school was in the smaller division, added 2½ inches to the Class C record yesterday when he cleared 6 feet 3¼ inches. It smashed the mark set by Steve Williams of Boyne City in 1959.

## New Mile Mark Run In Class A

ANN ARBOR — (AP)—Louis Scott, a tiny Detroit Eastern junior, blazed to the fastest mile in Michigan prep history, and Grosse Pointe and Muskegon Heights tied for the championship in the Class A High School track meet Saturday.

The Heights, Grosse Pointe and defending champion Flint Northern entered the final event — the one-mile relay — just one point apart. With the outcome riding on this one race, Muskegon Heights finished third and Grosse Pointe fourth to tie for the title while Northern could only muster a seventh place finish.

Grosse Pointe and Muskegon Heights each had 30 points and Northern had 27.

Scott, a 16-year-old who weighs just 135 pounds and stands 56, upset Dick Sharkey of Detroit Redford capturing a sensational mile run by 15 feet in 4:17.4.

It was the only record broken on a murky day and by the time the mile relay rolled around, it was raining hard and the track was soaked.

Scott's mile was one of the early events and was run on a dry track. He shattered the state record of 4:21.8 set by Grosse Pointe's Rem Purdy in 1958 and was better than the 4:17.7 mile by Detroit Denby's Frank Carrissimi, the fastest ever in the state until today, run in 1958.

## Albion Nine Loses Opening Tilt, 5-0

ALBION — Albion High School's baseball team launched its belated season—as adopted by the Twin Valley Conference this year—yesterday by being handed a 5-0 defeat by Jackson St. Mary.

St. Mary, which owns a 101 record, had only four hits but made all of them count in their run-making. Reliever Dave Anderson of Albion retired 10 men in order while he was in. Gary Johnson got two hits for the Wildcats—a double and single

Harmon Killebrew smacked his 10th home run and Camilo Pascual pitched his seventh victory as the Twins ended a three-game losing streak against the White Sox.

Willie Mays' 10th inning home run with a runner on base brought San Francisco's Giants from behind and gave them a 7-6 victory over the New York Mets.

It was the second homer of the game and the 16th of the season for Mays, whose first circuit blow, in the eighth, had tied the score at 5-5. The Mets went ahead in the top of the 10th on Felix Mantilla's home run off Don Larsen.

The loser was Jay Hook, who went all the way. Mays also hit a triple and drew a base on balls in five times at bat.

Southpaw Sandy Koufax struck out 16 as the Los Angeles Dodgers won their sixth in a row with a 6-3 decision over Philadelphia. Wally Moon sent in the clinching run with a pinch single in the seventh inning and Koufax singled in an insurance marker. Tommy Davis had three Dodger hits with two runs batted in and Willie Davis added a homer. Roy Sievers homered for the Phils.

## School for the Deaf Cops 'D' Track Title

MOUNT PLEASANT—(AP)—Michigan School for the Deaf withstood determined challenges from Covert, Martin and Wolverine to retain its state Class D High School Track title here Saturday.

MSD rolled up 41 points to second-place Covert's 37, collecting four first places and gaining a decisive edge with a sweep of the first three places in the broad jump.

Covert had five second places and a third but failed to win an event. Martin finished third with 29½ points and Wolverine, picking up four firsts but no supplementary places, was fourth with 28.

Michigan School for the Deaf won the mile relay, the 880 relay, the 440 dash and the broad jump, slamming the first three places in the latter event as Don Smith set a new meet record of 21.5".

The meet's only triple winner was Dave Woods of Wolverine, who set marks of 15.5 in the 120 high hurdles and 20.5 in the 180 lows, and won the shot put with a heave of 49' 11½".

The MSD mile relay team shaved two full seconds off its own 1961 meet record of 3:37.4 with a 3:35.4 clocking.

Two other meet records were established, for a total of six in the 13 events.
