

# MSD Trackmen Repeat as State C

## Montrose Fifth in 'C'

### Tartars Win 4 Events In Getting 41 Points

**MOUNT PLEASANT**—Michigan School for the Deaf's track team and Coach Earl Roberts headed for Frankenmuth and a victory dinner Saturday night with a bus full of trophies.

a Lower and Upper Peninsula final. The Tartars had been beaten in the Central Michigan Relays by Pickford, an Upper Peninsula school.

"But I think we'd have beaten Pickford in a regular meet," said MSD Faculty Manager Wayne Sheathelm.

MSD picked up a whopping 18 points in the broad jump on the 7-6-5-4-3-2-1 scoring basis, inaugurated this year. Defending champion Don Smith leaped 21 feet 5 inches to break the Class D record of 21-1 3/4 by Schoolcraft's Alis Grinbergs in 1956. Twin brother Ron jumped 21-1 1/4 and teammate Gary Blumerick 20-7 3/4.

**BUT THE TARTARS** still trailed Covert by three points going into the last event—the mile relay. Covert hadn't qualified for the event and MSD's Jerry Vernon, Steve Kovacs, R. Smith and Caswell Hassell came home first in 3:35.4, bettering the 3:37.4 record the school set last year.

MSD won the 880 relay in 1:35.0, five-tenths of a second off the record and only two-tenths faster than fellow Motor Valley Conference member Morrize.

The Tartars had Blumerick, Zito, D. Smith and Hassell running against Morrize's Darwin Hoag, Dick Freeman, George Klee and Roy McAvoy. Hassell's lead at the tape was less than a foot.

Abram Powell gave the Tartars seven more points as he breezed to the 440 title in :51.9, two-tenths

of a second above the record. MSD picked up its other two points with Bob Zwings sixth in the 220.

**MORRICE TIED FOR 15TH** place with 10 points. Hoag's 10.8 100-yard dash took fourth to combine with the 880 relay second for the school's only points. Byron got 2 1/2 on Dava Maylum's sixth in the low hurdles and Dan Davis' tie for seventh in the pole vault. Flint St. Matthew got two points as freshman Roger Houle cleared 5-7 in the high jump for sixth place.

Individual Class D stars were Dave Woods of Wolverine, winning the shot put and both hurdles, and Hildred Lewis of Memphis who sprinted home to win the mile in a record 4:35.4.

In Class C, Montrose's mile relay team of Dave Horner, Dan Sweller, Joe Stewart and Mike Coke finished second to Bay City St. Phillip as Coke couldn't quite catch anchor Jim Bauman. Coke was fourth in the 880 in 2:04.2. Other Montrose points came with Ray Nickolas' four-way tie for second in the pole vault and Gary Cooper's fifth in the shot.

"WE WEREN'T quite in shape," said Coke. "We got back from our senior trip (a four-day Great Lakes cruise) Wednesday and didn't have time to get ready."

Flint Holy Redeemer tied for 14th in Class C with six points as Joe Hajec took fourth with a 20-9 3/4 broad jump and Jim Balinger sixth in the shot with a 45-9 1/4 heave Goodrich tied for 32nd with Chet Dow's sixth in both hurdles picking up four points.

Two Class C records fell Lansing St. Mary's 880 relay team won in 1:33.5 and Charles Washington of Centreville High jumped 6-3 1/4.

### Detroit's Wright Defeats Moyer In 10-Rounder

NEW YORK (AP)—Detroit's Ted Wright piled up a big lead in the early rounds Saturday night and outpointed bulling Phil Moyer of Portland, Ore., in a spirited television 10-rounder at Madison Square Garden.

The 25-year-old Detroit, ranked eighth among the welterweights, used a snapping left jab to keep off his heavier foe and open the way for fast combinations in the first three rounds.

Teddy took all three of those rounds and Moyer, although he came on strong in the second half of the fight, couldn't overcome that heavy deficit.

The three officials voted for Wright by the following round scores: Referee Teddy Martin 5-2, Judge Al Berl 5-4-1. The AP card had Wright in front 5-4-1.

Moyer, 23, took the fight as a sub on short notice for his ailing brother Denny. It was his second fight in eight days.
