Records Smashed in Champions' Prep Track Meet Here

Joe Parham's Effort Best Before 2,000

Area Stars Seize Four First Places

By JACK MOSS Gazette Sports Writer Michigan prep track and field stars, with Kalamazoo area entries leading the way, put on a record - smashing performance in the seventh annual Champion of Champions meet Wednesday evening at Angell Field. A crowd of nearly 2,000 fans turned out in perfect weather.

Two state records were equaled, one bettered in the annual classic sponsored by the Kalamazoo Junior Chamber of Commerce. And three new meet records were set, three others matched.

Lower enrollment class school stars from the Kalamazoo area won four events in the gala meet, but the outstanding individual performer was Muskegon Heights' great sprint star, Joe Parham.

Parham, who won for his school The Gazette trophy for the outstanding individual performer, won the 100-yard dash in :09.8, the 220 in :21.6 and anchored the Tiger 880yard relay team to a 1:30 clocking. The century and relay times equal state records.

The meet's only other double winner was Gerald Cerulla, the greater hurdler from Wyandotte Roosevelt. He won the highs in a remarkable:14.5 and the lows in 20 second flat. Little Centreville provided two individual winners to set the area pace.

Charles Washington set a new meet high jump record of 6 feet, 31/4 inches and Gary Tesfeet, 7½ inches and his victims included state Class A champion Dick Wells of Grand




