Tigers Win Five Events at Kazoo Invitational Meet

KALAMAZOO—Muskegon Heights, state class A co-champion, completely dominated the eighth annual Jaycee Champion of Champions track meet at Angell Field here Wednesday.

The Tigers won five events, set a new Greater Muskegon record, and sprinter Joe Parham was named the outstanding individual in the meet.

Parham won the 100-yard dash in 9.8 seconds and the 220-yard dash in 21.6 seconds.

Bucs Take Two From Godwin

GRAND HAVEN — Coach Steve Sluka's baseball team ran its season's record up to 19 won and 9 lost in a double win over Godwin Heights High School Memorial Day. The Bucs will wind up their season Monday in a postponed game at Muskegon Heights.

The blue and gold won their twin bill Wednesday, at Sluka Field, mainly on some heavy sticking by Larry Prelesnik, third sacker, and Rog Weavers, first baseman. Lachman held Godwin to five hits in the opener, a morning game, and Grand Haven won handily, 10 to 5.

Prelesnik hit a triple and a single in this fray and Weavers collected a triple, double and a single. Grand Haven collected nine hits in this game.

The afternoon game was a runaway, 12 to 6, with Nagtzaam, a 10th grader, and Don Blexman permitting only five God-

The Heights mile relay team of Jim Johnson, Buck Smith, Len Martin and Leroy Fialek smashed the Greater Muskegon record by four seconds in winning the event in a fantastic 3:24.7.

Martin also won the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches and took fourth in the 880-yard run.

The 880-yard relay team of Chuck Swenor, Fialek, Johnson and Parham swept its event in 1:30.

Sam McMurray, star Tiger quartermiler, declined to compete and coach Rudy Thies announced that he has been dropped from the team for the Lake Michigan Athletic Conference meet at Grand Haven Friday. Ruvell Martin will run in the mile relay in the league meet with Johnson competing in the open 440.

Mickey Pickel, Muskegon's lone representative in the meet here, finished in a tie for second in the pole vault.

Donn VanSchelven of Grand Haven was second in the 880-yard run and the Grand Haven mile relay team finished second to the Tigers in its event.
