

# Thinclads Second: All-Sports Trophy Remains In City

Ann Arbor High closed its 1961-62 athletic record book today and reflected on one of the best sports years in the history of the school.

For the second straight year and for the fourth year in the last six, the Six-A League All-Sports Trophy will have its home in the Ann Arbor trophy case.

Pioneering teams of the fall, winter, and spring compiled a school-high total of 40 points for the all-sports award, gathering up the final five with a second-place finish in the league track meet here Saturday.

In the past, Ann Arbor has fielded better teams in each of the nine sports, but seldom, if ever, has it been so consistently proficient—from the time of the opening football victory over Grosse Pointe last Sept. 16 until the record-setting mile-relay

"I've got to be happy with the result even if we finished second," said Ryan. "What more can a coach ask when so many of his boys do their best?"

Johnston and Ken Dyer accounted for the only Ann Arbor firsts, Johnston winning the 880 without being pushed in 1:59 and Dyer in a three-way tie for the high-jump championship with a six-foot leap.

Sexton won its third straight championship with a group of eight seniors who have never tasted defeat as a team except in the state meets. The Big Reds had most of their expected first-place performances but surprised their foes with more depth than anticipated, scoring in every event and often heavily.

Big Red Dick Allen lost the 100-yard dash to Three-Time Champion Jim Burise of Battle Creek even though Burise's troublesome knee was well-taped, Burise timed the gun perfectly and was off to a flying start. Allen came back to win the 220 and halt Burise's bid in that event for a third straight championship.

No other record was broken except the mile-relay mark. However, Sexton's 880 relay crew was home in 1:31.3 tying a mark set by Jackson in 1957.
