Ann Arbor High closed its 1961-62 athletic record book today and reflected on one of the best sports years in the history of the school.

For the second straight year and for the fourth year in the last six, the Six-A League All-Sports Trophy will have its home in the Ann Arbor trophy case.

Pioneer teams of the fall, winter, and spring compiled a school-high total of 40 points for the all-sports award, gathering up the final five witth a second-place finish in the league track meet here Saturday.
