

U-D High, Servite Win Run Honors

Defending champion University of Detroit High, in winning its third of the four Catholic League cross-country championships yesterday at River Rouge Park, again proved that balance and not necessarily the best individual speed often decides a team title.

Servite's Dan LeMay and Leon Jasionowski finished one-two, only 3.9 seconds apart, in settling the individual honors, but the East Side school wound up tied for second position with Catholic Central at 81 points. LeMay was clocked in 9:56.1 to Jasionowski's 10 minutes.

Paul Schmitt trailed in the third slot as U. of D. led the 13-school field with 68 points. His teammate, Mike Boylan, was ninth. The champions also took the 16th, 18th and 22nd positions.

Servite also grabbed eighth (George Garza) and 13th (Dick Hebben) spots.

Sergite's fifth runner, Leon Jasionowski's brother, Tom, finished 57th in the field of 91 entries.

Catholic Central's bid was topped by Larry Amesse (11th), Bob Geist (12th) and John McGannon (15th), plus the 19th and 24th slots.

Ann Arbor St. Thomas sophomore Jack Hall finished fourth, followed by state Class A regional champion John Bantle, of Austin; John Fredette, of St. Joseph; and Ed Bertrand, of De La Salle. Fredette's brother, Mike, was 10th.

Mike Baker, runnerup to Riverview's Gary Schrader, paced Garden City to the Mid-Wayne League cross-country title at Warren Valley. The champions had posted a 6-0 dual meet record. Schrader was timed in 10:29 as Riverview settled for third place with 78 points to Garden City's 33 and Inkster Robichaud's 72. Baker

was clocked in 10:34. Other team point totals were Taylor Center, 79; Lutheran West, 87; Schaefer, 155, and Inkster, 200.
