FAST START IN TRACK

Mile Champ Ails, But Eastern Rolls

In one short month high school track will have come and gone. For that reason Thursday, with its warming trend and bright sunshine, was banner day.

Lou Scott, the greatest schoolboy miler in Michigan history, wheezed his way to a 4:28.8 mile on Osborn's slow track in leading Eastern to a 93-16 triumph. Lou, only 130 pounds and 5 feet 6, labored under a chest cold.

Lou is the State Class A king with a 4:13.2 record in the City League.

"IF WE CAN keep him in the mile, he should get under 4:10 this season," said coach Lorenzo Wright, the onetime Olympic sprinter.

In winning all 13 events, Eastern got a :52.7 quarter mile from Jim Wright. There were exceptional efforts elsewhere, too.

Cass Tech edged Northeastern, 56-53, despite a triple by Northeastern's Henry Williams, who won the 100-yard dash in :10.4, the 220 in :23 and broad jump with a leap of 19 feet, 11½ inches.

Mumford's Buddy Bryant was clocked in :09.9 in the century and :21.5 in the 220 in helping the Mustangs down Southeastern 66½-42½. George Wesson of Southeastern won the 440 in :50.7.

CHET SARZYNSKI won the broad jump and 880 in Cody's 58½-50½ decision over Chadsey. Matt Jackson won both sprints for Chadsey.

Northwestern flashed balance in defeating Redford, 61-48. Jesse Mitchell turned in a 1:56.1 half mile and Marvin Harrison a :51.5 quarter mile for the winners. Art Link's 4:27.5 mile was the best performance for the Huskies.



Rich LaBair won both dashes and Chuck Cole both hurdles as


