UNBEATEN SQUAD LOOKS FOR STATE HONORS

Track Trio Starring at Hazel Park

Hurdler-sprinter Das Campbell, pole vaulter Vern Hill and high jumper-broad jumper Curt Ring would make any coach happy — and Jack Boughton, of Hazel Park, has all three.

"They've done very well so far this season," Boughton beamed as he discussed his trio of prep track and field stars. He has reason to smile.

Campbell, for example. threatens the 19-second state record for the 180yard low hurdles set in 1958 by Farmington's Rex Cawley, now at

Hill has a good chance to better the pole vault record of 13 feet, 3 inches established in 1959 by Birmingham Seaholm's Bill Alcorn, who later competed at Michigan State. Ring figures prominently in in an elite group of boys gunning for the high jump mark of 6-4 9-16. Michigan's Al Ammerman set the height in 1960 while performing at Dearborn High.

top condition either. But his trouble isn't physical.

"We've switched him from the steel pole to fiberglass and he's just really getting the feel of it." Boughton said. "His best jump came with the steel pole, but the longer (16-foot) glass pole apparently will be better.

"There were 75 vaulters at Mansfield and only a halfdozen didn't have fiberglass. Vern was one of them. He was the only one to make the finals with a steel pole."

Ring, the third member of the trio, has high jumped 6plus and belongs to a select class A group that includes defending champion Al ern: Stan Allen, of Eastern;


