# Eastern All the Way

Eastern High, girding for a defense of its City League track title next month, methodically cut down 16 rivals Saturday in winning the Redford Relays.

The Indians met this first big challenge of the season by rolling up 66 points, claiming two first places and three seconds and scoring in 10 of the 12 events on a bright but cool afternoon.

Coach Lorenzo Wright, the onetime Olympic sprinter, seemed to have an endless stream of talent including the flashy Lou Scott, the state schoolboy mile champion.

On this afternoon, however, little Lou ran two anchor legs at shorter distances.

**HE TURNED** in a brilliant 1:55.8 half mile, less than a second off Terry Moore's league record and well below the official state mark of 1:56.1 held by Charlotte's Mike Martins.

Then he came back with a :51.7 quartermile while anchoring the Indians' mile-relay team which failed to place despite his fancy leg work.

**Redford and Mackenzie** both fielded excellent four-somes in two of the eight running events.

Coach Bruce Waha, of Redford, just may have the best set of half milers in the state in John Kinsel, Tom White, Dave McKelvey and Curtis Smith who combined to turn in a record effort of eight minutes, 11.6 seconds in the two mile relay.

A Mackenzie foursome of Dennis Lugar, Cottrell Poole, Duane Varner and Chuck Poindexter won the mile relay in 3:27.5, less than two seconds off the state record. Complete results:

### Clarke Wins British Race In a Lotus

**SILVERSTONE** England—Jim Clarke, a Scottish farmer, won the British International Trophy auto race Saturday in a Lotus which was in the pits with mechanical troubles until the early hours of the morning.

Only 11 of 21 starters finished the gruelling 52 laps that totaled 152 miles. Second was New Zealander Bruce McLaren in a works Cooper with Trevor Taylor of Britain third in a Lotus.

Among the non-finishers was Graham Hill, world champion, whose BRM went out with fuel pump trouble on the 31st lap when he was in sixth place.

Clarke won with an average speed of 108.2 mph.
