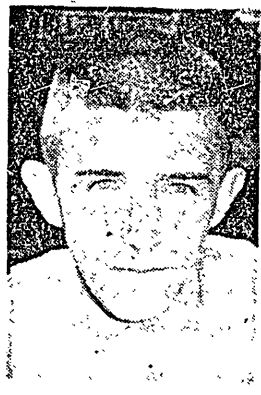


Kearsley's Title 3rd in 4 Years



Nelson Graham Stars for Mt. Morris

Kearsley High started slowly, then rolled relentlessly to its third regional Class B track title in four years Saturday at Dort Field.

Coach Harry Brunet's Hornets scored 31 3/4 points to outdistance early challengers Mt. Morris (19 1/2) and Atherton (19). Lake Orion scored 18 points, Durand 17 1/2 and Swartz Creek 17.

Kearsley captured only three first places and left the record-setting to others.

SOPHOMORE SHOT putter Cliff Kittle of Atherton and hur-

ler Nelson Graham of Mt. Morris shouldered into the record books.

Kittle tossed the shot 50 feet, 11 inches to break the old mark of 49-9. Graham won the 120 high hurdles in a record 15.2 seconds, then became the meet's only double winner with a 21.1 clocking in the 180 low hurdles.

Besides these, the meet's best effort was a fine 4:35.5 mile run by Fenton's Jeri Stiles, who was pressed all the way by Lake Orion's Martin Townsend. It was the fastest Flint-area mile of the season. Kearsley's Ed Cummings, who won the regional mile last

year, didn't seriously threaten.

KEARSLEY WON the 440 with Franz Timm in 52.4 seconds, the 220 with Dave Joseph in 23.0 and the 880 relay with Gary Delle-mater, Timm, Eugene Boegner and Joseph in 1:34.5. Joseph had to come from behind to nip Mt. Morris anchor Jim Wood.

The Hornets gathered other points with Joseph second in the 100, Eugene Boegner third in the low hurdles, Cummings third in the mile, Boegner fourth in the high hurdles, Randy Dunn fourth in the mile Dellemater fifth in

the 100, Jerry Cowan fifth in the 880 and Dave Wright tied for fourth in the high jump.

The first three places in each event qualify for Saturday's state Class B finals at Ann Arbor

WHILE KITTLE was Atherton's outstanding performer, Bob Turner was its leading point-getter with a second in the high hurdles, second in the lows and third in the high jump.

Swartz Creek's Mike Tkacz won the 100-yard dash in 10.8 seconds and was second in the 220. St. Michael's Dick Fox won the broad

jump with a 21-foot leap. Bendle's Bob Sorensen captured the pole vault with a 11-6 vault and Ches-aning's Al Vondrasak raced to first place in the 880 in 2:03.3.

Durand showed its muscles in the field events as Dave Wells and Bill Shepherd finished 1-2 in the high jump, Wells and Mike Davenport were 2-3 in the shot put and Wells tied for fourth in the pole vault.

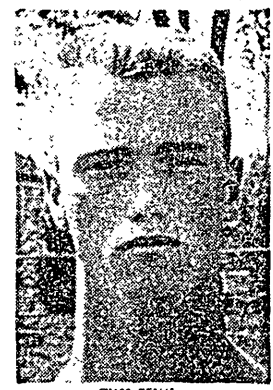
Flushing Coach Al Gratsch called the shot in the mile relay when Stiles he said his Raiders might set a record "if they don't drop the baton."

The Raiders were out in front when Kirk Hamilton dropped the baton taking a handoff from De Hobby and fell while trying to retrieve it. The loss of time knocked Flushing out of a qualifying spot but it still managed fourth place. Holly won the event.

Morrice Star Sets Two Records

MSD Title String at Five

Abram Powell snapped a 23-year-old record in the 440-yard dash to help his teammates bring Michigan School for the Deaf its fifth straight Class D regional track title (seventh in nine years) Saturday at Dort Field.

Powell ran the distance in 51.6 seconds to erase the old mark of 53.0 set by MSD's Willard Griswold in 1940. It was one of six Class D records.

Coach Earl Roberts' defending state champion Tartars won easily. MSD had 46 points to 24 for second-place Morrice.

"WE'VE GOT AN outside chance in the state meet this year," said Roberts. The top three

placers in each event qualify for Saturday's state Class D finals at Mount Pleasant.

MSD set another record when Bill Hoffmeyer, Anson Mitchell, Dom Zito and Powell won the 880 relay in 1:34.4. But the individual star of the day was Morrice's Darwin Hoag, who set records in the 100-yard dash (10.4 seconds) and 220 (23.3).

Waterford's Bob Schaffer shattered the old pole vault record of 10-10 1/2 by vaulting 11-6. Birmingham Country Day's John Swain won the mile in a record 4:45.5.

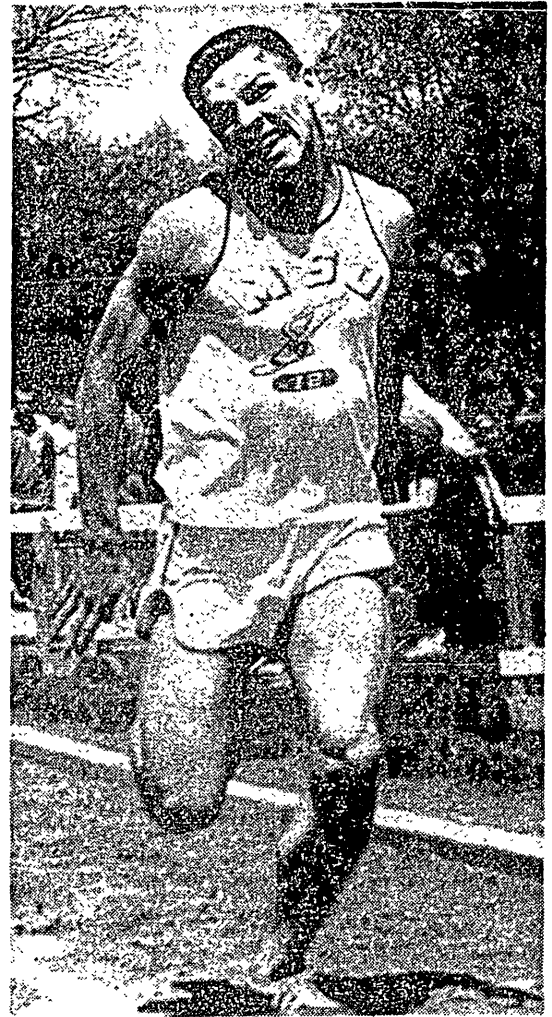
MSD ALSO WON the shot put with Dave Takacs' 47-6 throw, the mile 880 with Ron Scripser and the mile

relay with Jerry Vernon, Frank Fickies, Steve Kovacs and Scripser.

The Tartars also qualified Dennis Schemenauer second in the shot put, Zito second in the 220 and third in the 100 and Glindell Young third in the pole vault.

Other MSD point-getters who failed to qualify were Bill Angelbeck fourth in the high hurdles, Scripser fourth in the broad jump, Kovacs fourth in the 440 and Steve Davis fifth in the 880.

Mt. Morris St. Mary finished fifth with George Hill in the mile and Larry DuPlanty in the broad jump taking seconds.—GUSTIN

With 26 points, Redeemer was far behind regional champ Boys Training School of Lansing, which picked up 5 1/2.

That wasn't Hajec's fault. He won the 220 in 23.1 seconds, the 100-yard dash in 10.7 and the broad jump with a 20-6 leap. Teammate Bernie McAra was second in the 180 low hurdles and Jim Ballinger third in the shot put (46-10 1/2). All qualify for the state Class C meet Saturday at Mount Pleasant.

Other Redeemer point-getters who failed to qualify were Ed Tomei fifth in the high and low hurdles and an 880 relay team which placed fifth.

Flint St. Agnes picked up 3 1/2 points when qualifier Martin Thompson tied for second in the high jump.

Lake Fenton got three points with Al McDonald's third-place (11-0) pole vault and Flint Hamady 1-5 point when Vern Smith tied for fifth in the pole vault. Flint St. John Vianney failed to score.
