

IN 45TH SCAL TRACK MEET

St. Clair, Marine City Ready To Oust 7-Year Champ Vikings

Marysville High's seven-year reign stands in jeopardy when the St. Clair Area League holds its 45th annual track and field league meet Wednesday at Marysville City Park.

The Vikings, winners the last seven years of team honors will have their toughest competition from St. Clair, last year's runner-up, and Marine City as both have shown impressive times, heights and distances in dual and triangular meets.

The preliminaries in the running events will start at 2:30 p. m. along with the field events. Finals in all running events will begin as soon as the preliminar-

ies and the field events are completed.

PORT HURON Catholic, joining the league next season, will be on hand to compete but will not receive points.

Other league schools participating are: Cros-Lex, Richmond, Yale, St. Stephen and Algonac. Bob Sullivan, Marysville High athletic director and meet manager said, "we have dominated the league for the last seven years but, this year's meet will be close, real close."

Eleven of the area's outstanding track and field performers will be competing against one another for top honors.

Leo Vossen, St. Clair's speedy

sprinter with a fast time of :10.2.8 in the 100-yard dash,

will be giving last year's winner, Al Smarch of Marysville a battle with Dave Krenke of St. Clair and Joe Lozano of St. Stephen challengers.

Lozano and John Holmes of Richmond share times of :23.4 in the 220-yard dash with Vossen only one-tenth of a second behind.

Ron Frantz of St. Clair holds a time of :53.0.2 in the 440-yard dash with no one in sight and might be virtually unopposed.

The 880-yard run and the mile could be up for grabs with either the Vikings or the Saints top rated.

The Mariner's John Holladay and Dick Rinn of the Saints stand less than a second apart in the high hurdles with Krenke's time of :21 flat tops in the low hurdles.

ST. CLAIR'S 880-yard relay team has a time of 1:37.2 for their best effort while Marine City and Algonac have times of 3:45.7 and 3:49.4 in the mile relay.

Al Rickert of the Blue Devils had a leap of 20-feet, 3-inches in the broad jump and will most

likely battle it out with the Viking's Bill Brown.

Glen Bannister of Cros-Lex has been hitting new heights in the pole vault and so has Holladay, and Holladay will be trying to better Bannister in revenge of last year's second place finish. The Vikings' Dennis White will also be crowding the top two vaulters of a year ago.

Fred Schroeder, of Cros-Lex, twice having broken the school record in the shot put, with a heave of 46-feet, 8-inches will try and overcome Yale's ace shot putter and record holder Joe Iwanowski who has a put of 54-feet, 5-inches.
