

COLTS OVERCOME CHADSEY 'FALSE START' Northwestern Title Run Is Easier

For five events Wednesday, Chadsey High dreamed of a track upset. Northwestern, the City League's West Side king six of the past seven years, had been shut out in the 100-yard dash and the Explorers were only two points down to the champs, 42-40.

But two events later Northwestern was back in stride, Chadsey's dreams had vanished, and the Colts were on their way to one of their easiest titles in recent years. Northwestern scored four

firsts, picked up points in 10 of the 13 events, and ran up a top-heavy 99 points to 71½ for Chadsey. Bedford finished a respectable third with 85 points. No one else was close.

Chadsey's Matt Jackson was the swiftest sprinter. Matt won the 100 in :10 flat and the 220 in :22 flat in addition to anchoring his winning 880-yard relay team.
