

5 Records Fall at Track Trials

Five records, all in the running events, were set yesterday in the Catholic League track and field eliminations at Pershing High.

Foremost among the performances of some 450 athletes was the 52.1 clocking for the 440 by Catholic Central's Mark Sweeney that erased a 10-year-old mark. The previous peak was 52.5 by De La Salle's Bob Coseglia in 1953.

Pat Fulford, of Notre Dame, one of three double winners, eclipsed the 220 record with a time of 22.3. He also won the 100 in the Central bracket trials in 10.3.

230 ADVANCE

Six qualifiers in each of 13 events for the three brackets—Central, Double-A and Class A—advance to the title meet at 2 p.m. June 8 at Pershing. Some 230 athletes will comprise the field.

U. of D's Dick Reamer clipped 6.1 seconds off the mile record with a 4:32.8 clocking. Other performances that set new standards were Frank Haggerty's 15.1 for the high hurdles for Catholic Central and Richard Kalamek's 2:01.4 for the 880 run for Notre Dame.

Jerome Patton, a St. Joseph junior, tied the low hurdles mark of 20 seconds flat set also in 1953 by one of his school's products, Jim Kossek.

MISSES IN HIGHS

In his duel with Haggerty, Patton missed an opportunity of becoming a double winner when he tripped over a high hurdle and was disqualified after bounding into another lane.

The flock of elimination records, recognized by the league, overshadowed two other fine efforts. Holy Redeemer's Jim Woodruff tied the former 220 mark of 22.4 and Servite's Leon Jasionowski, in trailing Reamer's new mile record, also eclipsed the former peak with a time of 4:37. Two years ago

CC's Paul Sullivan set the old standard of 4:38.9.

Other double winners were in the Class A ranks — Divine Child's George Rodriguez and Brother Rice's Pete Foley. Rodriguez paced the bracket's high and low hurdles in 16.2 and 21.3, while Foley swept the 100 in 10.4 and the 220 in 22.9.

U-D CENTRAL LEADER

U. of D., a strong contender for the team title, topped the Central bracket by a 10-point bulge over CC, 49-39. Cathedral posted 32 2/3, Notre Dame 28, De La Salle 25 1/3 and St. Joseph 17.

Benedictine prevailed in Double-A by one point over Redeemer, 45 1/2-44 1/2. They were trailed by Servite's 26, Dearborn Sacred Heart's 19, St. Anthony's 16, Shrine's 15, St. Ambrose's 11 and Redford St. Mary's 9.

Brother Rice had a 50-point bulge over St. Alphonsus (83-33) in Class A. Other scores were Divine Child 21, St. David 15, St. Frances Cabrini 11, Roseville Sacred Heart 9, St. Patrick 6 and St. Paul 5.

Dragster Timed at 210-212 MPH

Two different drivers gunned Art Arfons' Green Monster at more than 210 miles an hour yesterday at the Detroit Dragway.

Chuck Hatcher hit 211.76 m.p.h. (7.75 seconds elapsed for the quarter-mile), and Doug Rose did 212.76 (7.73 seconds) and 210.76 (7.82 seconds).

Bill Schirey, of Dearborn, was top stock eliminator at 117.18 m.p.h. (12.25 seconds), and Gordon Collett, of Portsmouth, O., had the best time, 8.57 seconds (175.65 m.p.h.).
