# Eastern Wins Track Title

Thirteen points in the pole vault, final event on a near-perfect day for track, carried Eastern High to a victory Friday in the City League East Side finals.

The victory capped Mumford's four-year reign. Eastern finished with 75½ points, barely nipping underdog Pershing 71½ point total. Mumford finished third with 66.

EASTERN won only two firsts but scored in 10 of the 13 events. Lou Scott won the 800 for the Indians in 1:58.3, less than a second off the league record.

Eastern's other victory came in the broad jump, where Ronnie Ward won the event with a leap of 20 feet 10½ inches.

George Womack of Southeastern turned in a disappointing performance of 59.4 in the 400. He set a state record of 1:03 1/2 last Saturday in winning the event at East Lansing.

One of the day's best efforts was a 1:20.4 by Mumford's eight yard relay team. A poor baton exchange cost the Mustangs a chance of bettering the league record of 1:18.2 set by Northwestern in 1960.

Qualifying for the City championships will take place Tuesday starting at 2 p.m. at Pershing High. The finals are scheduled Thursday. Friday's East Side summaries:

## Johnson Choice to Hold Title

### Willie Unlikely To Last Full 15

LAS VEGAS, Nev.—(AP)—Veteran Harold Johnson, a clever boxer-puncher, risks his world light heavyweight title and his 18-point winning string Saturday night here in America's gambling mecca against younger, faster and more muscular but less experienced Willie Pastrano.

Johnson, 34, of Philadelphia, will be making his second defense of the undisputed world 175-pound crown against 27-year-old Pastrano of Miami Beach in this nationally televised 15-rounder at the swanky Las Vegas Convention Center. It will be televised nationally to homes by ABC (channel 7, 10 p.m. Detroit time).

BECAUSE of his combined ringcraft and knockout punch, Johnson is a 2-1 favorite to win and the betting is "even money" that Pastrano does not last the full 15-rounds, which he is attempting for the first time. Willie's longest previous fight was a 12-rounder.

Co-promoters Mel Greb and Jack Doyle of the Silver State Sports Club hope for a crowd of 5,000 in the 5,600-seat convention center and a gate of about \$30,000. Television money
