

SECOND IN OAKLAND MEET

Ninth Straight EML Title Won by Seaholm Thinclads

Seaholm capped another perfect Eastern Michigan League track season Tuesday by defeating closest rival Hazel Park 56 to 34 for the EML championship in the league meet.

It was the Maple's ninth straight league title since they started their winning ways in 1955.

The 1963 season was marked by the 59th consecutive dual meet victory for Seaholm.

Saturday the Maples rolled up 46 points to take second place in the All-Oakland County Meet, won by Pontiac Central with 72.

The meet, with 22 teams competing, saw 10 new field records set and eight meet marks replaced.

BLOOMFIELD Hills followed Seaholm with 29 points for third place. The Barons claimed two meet records with its one-mile relay team of Jack Armstrong, Bob Richards, Tom Hoopengardner and Roger Stewart at 3:27.6 and Richards won the 880-yard run in 1:55.8.

Groves tied for 17th with two points and Brother Rice was one of four teams not scoring any points.

Ray Jobson of Seaholm won the 220-yard dash, in :21.8 to set a

new meet record and the 880 relay team of Bob Drothler, Howard Dubin, Kim Bateman and Jobson clocked 1:31.1 for a new field record.

JACK HARVEY, by far the best shot putter in Michigan this year, dominated the competition in his event with a heave of 55-6 1/4. Gage Cooper placed sixth.

In the mile run, Jim Olson placed second at 4:27.9, which was good enough for a new school record. The old record was 4:28 set by Jack Bachelor last year.

Other pointmakers included Dave Kennedy, third in the 880, at 1:57.2; Bob Drothler, third in the 440, at :50.6 (also a school record); the mile relay team of John Kingscott,
