

Central Is Second At Huron Relays

YPSILANTI — Flint Central picked up three first places in Saturday's Huron Relays and scored 34 points to finish second to Birmingham Seaholm's 57 for the team title.

Central's Willie Buck won the 60-yard dash in 6.5 seconds, LeRoy Blassingame and Mac Henry Johnson each jumped 6-foot-1 for a high jump relay win, and the shuttle hurdle relay team of Archie Pearson, Gene Bowen, Len Hattchet and E. J. Williams got another victory.

Flint Northern was 13th with seven points. A rule prohibiting a contestant to enter an event without proper interval disqualified Flint Southwestern. Southwestern got seconds in the 880 relay and mile relay and a fourth in the high jump relay, but lost the points through the same infraction that cost Cen-

tral last year's Huron title.
