

East Lansing Trackmen Also Win

Everett Trips Eastern, Jackson

Strong southerly winds which were friendly to Everett trackmen last week became an opponent Tuesday night.

Thanks to the strong winds at East Lansing and Sexton last

week, the Viking trackmen posted some fast times in the sprints and hurdles. But the shoe was on the other foot Tuesday as the Vikings had to run into a strong southerly wind, resulting in their slowest performances of the season.

However, Everett still had little trouble winning as it scored 79 points compared to 31-2-3 for runnerup Eastern and 25-1-3 for Jackson at the Vikings' track.

In other action Tuesday, East Lansing won its second straight meet by beating Adrian, 65-44, while in Capital Circuit action, O'Rafferty edged Holt, 58-51, and Haslett downed Okemos, 76-33.

Everett improved its season record to 2-1 by winning eight of 13 events. Henry Patino had a hand in three of the triumphs, winning both hurdles and an-

choring the winning 880-yard relay team.

The best time of the night on a soggy cinder track was as :23.3 turned in by Jim Rapp of Everett in the quarter. Rapp also ran on the winning mile relay quartet.

Early was clocked in :13.3 for the 100-yard dash and :22.6 in the 220. Joe Cyberski also scored a double victory for the Raiders. He won the 880-yard run and also was first in the broad jump.

As usual, Jim Raphael led Haslett to its victory over Okemos. The 5-6 senior set a school record in the mile with a 4:37.1 performance as the Vikings won 10 events. Bill Fineout was a double winner for Haslett, taking the 100-yard dash and the broad jump while John Overholt paced Okemos with first places in both hurdles races.
