Midland's victories were in the shot put and 65-yard high hurdles. Steve Dowling's winning leap was 52 feet, 3½ inches, while Al Payne was clocked in 0:54.

A Lansing Eastern team took the medley relay with a 6:09. 31 clocking, and Eastern's Daryle Burt captured the mile in 4:15.5.
