

Stockbridge's Shepard Leads Area Entries

Huge Central Michigan Relays to Begin Friday

Dave Shepard, a veritable overall track star from Stockbridge, heads the list of area entries in the opening day events of the Central Michigan Relays at Mt. Pleasant Friday.

Shepard, Class B state high jump champion last year, will be seeking titles in four events at the two-day meet. Classes B and D will be run off Friday and Classes A and C set for Saturday. A total of 1,451 athletes from 85 schools will compete in the B section while 241 athletes from 39 schools will be in the D portion.

Area B schedule running Friday in addition to Stockbridge will be O'Farrell, Warrenton, Hasket, Okemos, Postville, Holt, Ionia, Okemos, Lakeland, Mason and St. Louis. Ashley and Fowler will be the only area representatives in Class D.

Shepard will be competing in the high jump, broad jump and both hurdles races but he's been doing best all season, in fact, he had only one meet with times coming in the broad jump when he had snap problems.

Stockbridge coach Herb Seeger said Shepard is the best trackman ever produced at the Ingham County League school and Shepard's performance so far this season give plenty of support in the claim.

"This season, Shepard had run the high hurdles in 12.2, the low hurdles in 28.1, broad jumped 21 feet, 10 1/2 inches and high jumped 6 feet, 9 1/2 inches, best ever top by a Central Michigan athlete. Each performance is a 1/4 among the top 10 in the state so far this season, making him the only athlete to be listed in the top 10 in four separate events. Each performance also leads the area list of best track performances, which opens below.

It's definitely on or a level-governed than last year," said Seeger in pointing out that Shepard is pointing out that Shepard is in p.d. 6-11, last year. "The thing he works on the lead in the high jump because our pit isn't too good. The high jump is the best event and it's the one he likes the best. He should be able to go higher than 6'11 1/2."

White Shepard is the top area individual at Mt. Pleasant. Hasket should turn in the top team performance. The Vikings of Coach Ben Rittenburg are particularly strong in the middle distances with Jim Raphael and Doug Madden. Raphael has run 2:42.3 in the half mile and 4:27.1 in the mile while Madden has a 2:02.1 in the 800.

O'Rafferty will make its argument last in the sprint medley relay with the quartet of Joe O'Rourke, Joe Hoiler, Larry Bauer and Terry Early.

The same foursome won the sprint medley event at The State Journal High School Relays earlier in the month. Listed below are the top performers by area trackmen so far this season. Greater Lansing trackmen were not considered in the listing.

The final two records were set by Hastings in the 800-yard relay with a 1:28.4 performance and by St. Johns with a 2:41.1 in the mile relay.
