

REGIONAL TRACK SURPRISES

Bathers, Romeo Win

Mt. Clemens, in Class A, and Romeo, in Class B, were surprise winners Saturday in state regional track eliminations at Warren-Figgevald High in a meet which was held in both rain and brilliant sunshine.

Grabbing seven firsts and scoring in 11 of the 13 events Mt. Clemens shaded favored Roseville, 48-46, for its first regional title in 12 years.

ROMEO, WHICH hadn't won a regional since 1953, won only three firsts but rolled up 32 points to win for coach Dick Caruss.

There was one excellent individual mark set as five track records went by the boards despite the sloppy going.

Fred Boile of East Detroit won the Class A broad jump at 23 feet even and favored by a good day next Saturday at Ann Arbor has to be accorded an outside chance of breaking Hayes Jones' state record of 23 feet 8 1/2 inches, set in 1956.
