

Big Reds Win, 67-42 Track Marks Fall In BC-Sexton Meet

The Central-Sexton High Track meet lived up to all expectations last night at the C. W. Post Field track even though the Big Reds from Lansing won as expected, 67-42. Approximately 800 fans watched Central's Arnie Williams win both sprints in his duel with Willie McKissic of Sexton. They also saw two new Bearcat varsity records set, one track and varsity mark tied and another track standard broken. Williams edged McKissic by

a foot in the 100-yard dash where he tied his own track and varsity mark of :09.7 seconds. He then bested the Sexton speedster in the 220-yard dash by about four feet.

The Bearcat 880-yard relay team of Dick Speights, Ken Richardson, Carl English and Williams set a new varsity mark in one minute, 29.2 seconds and Woody Carr set a new school high jump mark of six feet, one and three-quarter inches to top the old mark of 6-1 set by Adell Braxton in 1939 and tied by Bob Bradley in 1946.

The other track record was set by the Sexton mile relay team which was timed in three minutes, 26.4 seconds.

Speights won both his hurdle events and Joe Reno took the 880-yard run in the good time of 1:36.9. Sylvester Malone, a sophomore, won the mile in 4:36.9.

Sexton had too much overall strength as expected, sweeping the shot put, pole vault and 440-yard dash. The Big Reds also finished 2-3 in the mile, both hurdles, both dashes and the high jump. The summaries:
