

Title Is Won By Tecumseh

ALBION (AP) — Paced by speedster Steve Derby, Tecumseh High nosed out East Jackson for the Class B title in the weekend Dale R. Sprinkle-Albion College Track and Field Carnival.

Tecumseh scored 42 points to East Jackson's 39. Derby led the charge with victories in the 120-yard high hurdles (15.4), the 180-yard low hurdles (20.8), and then came back to win the high jump (five-feet, six inches).

Other team winners were Lansing Everett in Class Double-A, 54 points; Wayne in Class A, 41; Vandercook Lake and Ann Arbor University High in Class C, 35 each; and Covert in Class D with 65.

Despite a fast track and gusty winds, only two records fell. Both were in Class Double A.

Kalamazoo Central's Ron Nehring turned the 880-yard run in 1:58 flat to clip one and two-tenths seconds off the 1956 mark held by former Central runner Bob Lake.

Annie Williams of Battle Creek Central ripped off a 22.1-second clocking in the 220-yard dash, snipping one-tenth of a second off the joint mark of Willow Run's Bill Harrison (1959) and Ferndale's Dorie Reid (1962). Williams also won the 100-yard dash in 9.3 seconds.

Jackson's Devil Littlejohn cleared six-feet, 3 1/4 inches in the high jump to tie the mark set last year by Ann Arbor's Ken Dyer.

Ken Boushka of Adrian was the only double-winner in Class A. He won the 100-yard dash in 10.2, and came back to take the 220 in 22.6.
