

Time for 2-Mile Distance: 8:13.1

HOWELL—Howell high school thinclads placed seventh with 16 points in the 24th annual Central Michigan University Relays, Class "A" division held Saturday with an outstanding performance by the two-mile relay team.

The Highlander two-mile relay team composed of Jim Chapman, John Miller, Steve Zemper and Rick Dunn were victorious again and in winning in the time of 8:13.1 established a CMU Class "A" Relays record and also lowered their own school record which they had established in the Michigan State Relays.

The same foursome returned in the afternoon in the mile relay.

In this event the Highlanders

easily won their heat in the time of 3:30.3, which lowered their school record set earlier this year.

COACH BOB Bloomer's thinclads, however, had to settle for third place as Farmington and Lansing Sexton battled it out in the second heat with Farmington winning out in the time of 3:28.2.

Birmingham Seaholm won the relays with 62 points. Lansing Sexton was second with 54 and

one of Howell's regional foes, Flint Central, came in third with 50 points.

Pontiac Central was fourth with 34-2/3 points nosing out Roseville with 33. In sixth ahead of Howell was Farmington with 16-2/3 points.

HOWELL will journey to Lansing Thursday to meet with Lansing Everett, winners of the Hastings and Albion Class "A" Relays.

Lansing Everett is loaded with depth in every event.
