## Is Fastest

The state high school 220-yard record of 21.5 was broken twice in the Public School League triangular meet as two Detroit Central High whippets finished 1-2.

Horace Coleman, a 5-7, 135-pound senior, zipped through the tape on three watches in 21.1 with Ron Hampton, a 5-9, 155-pound football player, breathing down his neck with a clocking of 21.2.

Hampton also ran a 9.9 dead heat with Detroit Northeastern's Otha Trice in the 100-yard dash. This is the third best time in the state this year.

### ONE MAN TEAMS

Pershing High outran Mumford High 84-25, as two Pershing school records were set. Ed Taylor was clocked in the 100 in 10.0 and Al Hodges was timed in the 220-yard in 22.0.

Hodges, virtually a one man team, also broad jumped 21-5½, ran a leg in the winning 880 relay, and finished second in the shot put.

Northwestern, with grand slams in the 440, 880 and shot put, rushed over Ford High 70-39. The Colts also won both relays, the hurdles, and the mile. Willie Jerk scored 20 of Ford's 39-points as he won the 100 in .10.2, the 220 in 22.3, high jump 6 feet and broad jump 21-7.
