

Atherton, Flushing Girls Rule in Track

Sue Potter broke the softball throw record and Wanda Threlkeld surpassed all existing county broad jump standards to lead Atherton to its fifth County B League girls' title in six years Saturday.

Atherton gave a going-away present to Coach Gladys Chamberlain, who is retiring from

coaching, by taking five first and scoring 66 points to 36½ for runnerup Bentley.

Flushing used team depth to win the Big Nine Conference crown which was run concurrently with the County B meet at Bendle. Flushing got only three firsts but scored 50 points to 36½ for Kearsley and Davison.

The County B's individual standout was Lakeville's Kitty Beach, who won the 75 and 100-yard dashes and the broad jump.

Sue Potter's softball toss of 213-feet, 10 inches broke a 20-year old mark held by Gaines' Joyce Sill.

Among NAIA's Best

MOUNT PLEASANT (AP) — Track performances of two Central Michigan University athletes were listed among the best in the country by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) today.

Ivan Lacore's 14.2 - second clocking in the 120-yard hurdles tied him for fourth; while a time of 37.8 seconds in the 330-yard hurdles placed him fifth.

A 55-foot-½ inch effort in the shot put placed Pete Miskov seventh in this event, while a toss of 163-4¾ in the discus was good for sixth.
