

**BATTLE CREEK WINS 'A' TITLE****Two Track Records Tumble**

ANN ARBOR — It was another day for individual brilliance here Saturday on sunny, wind-swept Ferry Field.

While Battle Creek Central went home with the state Class A. title, its first championship since 1940, most of the cheers from 5,000 spectators were reserved for half a dozen standout individual performances.

**KEN DYER**, the 6-3 Ann Arbor High senior, and Wayne Lambert, from Saginaw Ar-

thur Hill, accounted for the only two records allowed. High, gusty winds, up to 12 miles an hour, ruined all other record efforts.

But Dyer and Lambert weren't to be denied.

**Dyer, who didn't miss until the high jump bar hit 6-7, finally went out at 6-7 $\frac{1}{4}$ , 2 $\frac{3}{4}$  inches over the previous state mark of 6-5 set a year ago by Flint Northern's Al Washington.**

Lambert outdueled Jim Haviland of Waterford Kettering and Lessel Hanspard of

Pontiac Central, to win the pole vault with a record leap of 13 feet, 11 $\frac{1}{8}$  inches.

It was an all-day effort as the event was the first to start and last to finish.

**THE RECORD** performance somewhat justified the fact Lambert had broken three Fiberglass poles at \$55 a crack during the last month to reach such heights.

One performance ruined by the wind was a 24-foot, 3-inch broad jump by Roseville's Dennis Lamiman.

The talented Roseville senior hit the finest jump of his career on his last try. But the winds were blowing at eight miles an hour and the feat was disallowed.

Battle Creek got its biggest lift from Arnie Williams and Dick Speights. Williams ran off with both sprints, a wind-assisted :9.8 100-yard dash and a :21.3 220.

Speights finished second in both hurdles. Thus Williams and Speights accounted for 26
