The talented Roseville sen-lor hit the finest jump of his career on his last try. But the winds were blowing at eight miles an hour and the feat was disallowed.

Battle Creek got its biggest lift from Arnie Williams and Dick Speights. Williams ran off with both sprints, a wind-:9.8 100-yard dash assisted and a :21.3 220.

Speights finished second in both hurdles. Thus Williams and Speights accounted for 26
